PROJECT REPORT

Supporting public school educators in their mission to provide a quality education and healthy environment to all students in Granada, Nicaragua since 2009.

2017 was a big year for Students of Granada. We received our NGO status from Nicaragua in March 2017 – a year in the making. In partnership with New York University Dental College, we completed the first year of a 3-year in-school preventative dental pilot in 4 public schools and facilitated a free dental clinic that provided treatment to more than 350 people. Our NGO status and successful implementation of these large projects help position the organization to expand services to more schools and develop new scalable instructional and health programs.

In 2018, we are continuing our work with NYU. For the first time, we will be partnering with CommunityBots to pilot a robotics program for middle school girls and with St. Joseph's Academy to set up a donation of 20 laptops that will be used for both computer literacy and the robotics programs. Our goal is to build a center that will provide a secure location for these activities within Escuela Carlos Bravo. We plan to leverage this investment by including space for a free permanent dental. We have already cleared customs with 3 dental units and are developing funding sources to initiate the project.

2017 Projects: Carlos Bravo (980 students)

Instruction:

- Laptops, software, commercial printer for the office
- Hundred's of books for the school library at Carlos Bravo
- Misc. school supplies (paper, pencils, markers, toner)
- Internet and phone access in the school office
- Sponsorship of teacher appreciation day

Infrastructure:

- Construction of PreK classroom and bathroom
- Maintenance of kitchen equipment and monthly propane delivery
- Plates, Cups, Bowls for school meals
- Preparation of rear wall for mural painting donated by Leslie Warren.
- Build out of secure storage area for food staples

- In partnership with New York University Dental College and Colgate, implementation of the first of a 3-year in school preventative dental pilot whose goal is to significantly reduce new cavities
- In partnership with New York University, free dental clinic providing clinical treatment to more than 350 adults and children in the area of Granada
- Water purification pilot at Carlos Bravo (2 units)
- Original facilitation of donation from TOM Shoes (2 pairs of shoes every 6 months at Carlos Bravo).
